Just last week, Chaplain Retchie rushed to a nearby hospital after being informed by AMSA that a Filipino seafarer had been taken to Emergency and was feeling anxious.

Time flies! As I reflect on some of the past events for this year, we have indeed touched many hearts and transformed many.

Pastoral Care and Visits

I recently visited a seafarer who had abdominal pain for six weeks on board his vessel. When his vessel arrived at Port Botany, immediately he was admitted to the hospital and had surgery the next day. He was diagnosed with appendicitis. Our chaplains, Jim and Retchie also provide pastoral care and visit seafarers in hospital as well as on board the vessels, touching many hearts and transforming many lives! They have said seafarers particularly enjoy talking about their homes and families. We also help them find people they can trust to talk to when they have issues that need addressing including recently, helping a container's crew to appeal to increase their water rations which were only 1.5 litres a day.

Sea Sunday at St Andrew's Cathedral - July 9

Thank you to St Andrew's Cathedral and Dean Rev Sandy Grant for hosting a Sea Sunday Service for the second time in 9 years. Farewell and Thank You to a Wise Leader

Clive Goodwin’s childhood mixing with seafarers led to a lifetime of volunteer faith-filled service despite the demands of running one of Sydney’s leading architectural firms. Clive has recently retired from Sydney Bethel Union (SBU) after 41 years as a trustee/director, including as Chair since 1982. “His business and life experience gave Clive an astute understanding of financial, environmental and welfare issues. His wisdom and steady hand at the SBU has been a substantial asset as our Mission coped with the changes and challenges of the last 40 years,” said MtS CEO Clayton Strong.

The Sydney Bethel Union, a registered charity founded in 1822, is the core funder to the Mission to Seafarers for all the ports where it operates in New South Wales.

Clive’s special connection with seafarers began as he was growing up living above the Mission to Seafarers’ previous premises at Circular Quay where his father Clive Andrew was the Principal Chaplain from 1942 to 1950.
